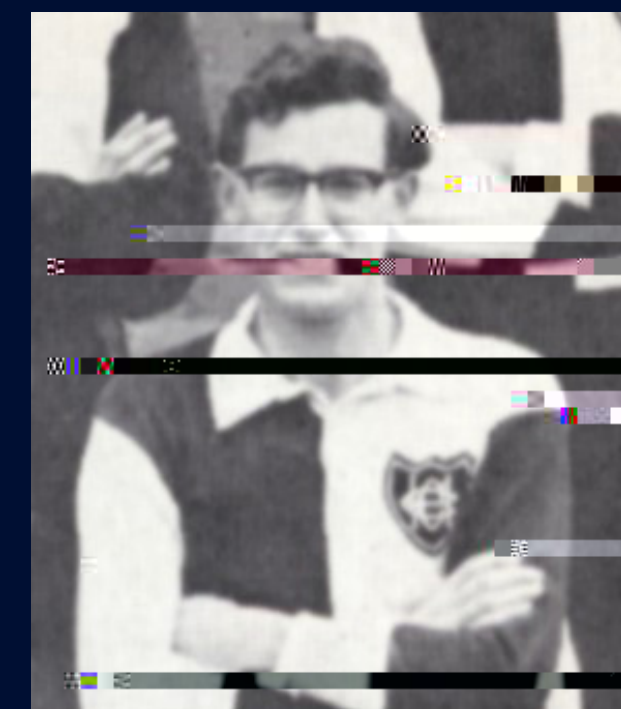

Sir Andrew Tipping

Sir Andrew is one of the longest serving senior judges in New Zealand.

Born in Oxford, England, he later moved with his family to New Zealand where he attended Christ Church College and the University of Canterbury.

Sir Andrew was appointed a judge of the High Court in 1986 and in 1997 became a judge of the Court of Appeal. The following year he was appointed to the Privy Council. He became one of the inaugural appointees to the Supreme Court of New Zealand in 2004. Sir Andrew served 26 years as a judge before retiring.

He has his time in the law taught him to be a good listener and of all kinds and a person's point before coming to a decision about it. Some people are better than others at explaining their position. Someone who is not a lawyer is a man who is not a lawyer.

His advice: Be reasonable. If something doesn't feel right, it's all right. This time be a good listener to yourself.
